Buddies Week #6: Musical memories


This week's activities are all about our favourite songs throughout history and the memories that music brings back for us. With your older Buddy, you'll...

- Play the **word game** Guitar Strings
- 2. Compete with your Buddy in a music quiz
- **3.** Create an album of your older Buddy's top tracks through the years
- **4.** Complete a **challenge** to learn one of your older Buddy's favourite songs

These activities can be done over phone or video calls to an older friend or family member. You can do them all in one go or across several calls, or simply pick and choose the ones that you'd like to try. We suggest you print the following pages, access them on a computer, or recreate them by hand to use as a guide as you chat with your older friend or family member.



 The first player thinks of a word or a short phrase that relates to music in some way - you could choose an instrument, a genre, or the name of a well known band. Make sure it's a word that you know how to spell. 2. Draw out a line of dashes - one dash for each letter in the word. For example, if you chose the word 'JAZZ', you would draw four dashes on a page or digital whiteboard.

5. Everyone else can start guessing letters by asking questions like: *"Is there an 'a' in* your word?" If any letters are guessed correctly, the leader fills in the blank.

If the wrong letters are guessed, the leader draws a guitar, adding a new part to the drawing with every wrong guess. The aim of the game is to guess the word before the final guitar string is drawn and the picture is complete.

- **6.** Which Disney film is **this song** from and for a bonus point which character sings it?
